

CryptoBatz Privacy Policy

This Privacy Policy is designed to help you understand how CryptoBatz and its related organizations and affiliates (“we”, “us” or “our”), collects, uses and shares personal information. We value your privacy, and we will not share your personal information with third parties except as described in this Privacy Policy without your consent.

BY USING THIS SITE, YOU AGREE TO BE BOUND BY THIS PRIVACY POLICY. IF YOU DO NOT AGREE WITH ANY OF THE TERMS OF THE PRIVACY POLICY, PLEASE DO NOT USE THIS SITE OR PROVIDE US WITH YOUR INFORMATION.

What this Privacy Policy Covers

This Privacy Policy applies to our collection, use and sharing of your personal information (a) when you visit our applications, websites and mobile sites, including in connection with the AncientBatz competition (collectively, the “Site”), (b) receive our communications; (c) participate in our online or offline activities or events, and (d) that we obtain from third parties such as resellers, database vendors, content publishers and suppliers. This Privacy Policy applies only to information gathered as described above and does not apply to any other information or websites not owned or operated by us or information collected by us through other means.

Personal Information We Collect

Information You Give Us. Personal information you may provide through the Site or otherwise communicate to us includes:

- *Contact and transaction information.* We collect information about you when you provide it to us in connection with our services, including as a result of participating in the AncientBatz competition along with CryptoBatz, MutantBatz, or any other associated features. This information may include your first and last name, IP address, and crypto wallet information.
- *Feedback and correspondence.* We may collect information about you when you request information, respond to surveys, or otherwise correspond with us.
- *Other information.* We may collect other information from you that is not specifically listed here. We may use such information in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

Information We Get From Others. We may obtain additional information about you from third party sources, such as service providers, vendors, social media sites, and advertising agencies to provide you with more relevant information about our services.

Information Automatically Collected. Our servers and third party service providers may automatically record certain information about how you use the Site, such as your Internet Protocol (IP) address, device and browser type, operating system, DNS, the pages or features of the Site that you browsed and the time spent on those pages or features, the frequency with which you use the Site, the links that you click on or use, and other statistics. We collect this information in server logs and by using cookies and similar tracking technologies. See our Cookie Policy, below. for more information.

Statistical Analyses. We use Google Analytics to help us gather statistical information about the visitors to our Site and how they use the Site on an anonymous, aggregate basis. However, we will not associate this data with your personally identifiable data unless required to do so to cooperate with law enforcement activity or other governmental request or to comply with law. We may use this information to gain a better understanding of the users of our Site, to improve our Site, and to improve our services. Depending on the type of browser and device that you use, you may have the ability to control the type of information that Google Analytics use. How We Use Your Personal Information

We use your personal information for the following purposes and as otherwise described to you in this Privacy Policy or at the time of collection:

To Provide the Site and our Services and to Communicate With You. We use your personal information:

- to provide our services;
- to provide, maintain and improve the Site;
- to better understand your needs and interests, and personalize your experience with the Site;
- to register you for contests;
- to respond to your requests, questions, comments, and feedback; and
- to perform website analytics and database management services.

For Compliance, Fraud Prevention and Safety. We may use your personal information as we believe appropriate to: (a) investigate or prevent violation of the law or your agreements with us; (b) protect our, your or others' rights, privacy, safety or property (including by prosecuting and defending legal claims); (c) protect, investigate and deter against fraudulent, harmful, unauthorized, unethical or illegal activity; (d) comply with applicable laws, lawful requests and legal process, such as to respond to subpoenas or requests from government authorities; and (e) where permitted by law in connection with a legal investigation. For example, we may share information with law enforcement to reduce the risk of fraud or if someone uses or attempts to use our site for illegal reasons.

With Your Consent. In some cases we may ask for your consent to collect, use or share your personal information.

How We Share your Personal Information

We may use third parties to help us design and operate the Site, provide services to support the Site, and process your information. For example, we may hire a company to run certain website applications, help us analyze our data, and process payment information. Unless otherwise indicated at the time we collect your information, if we allow third parties to access the personal information we collect, we will have contractual provisions or other appropriate protections in place to ensure such access is for limited purposes and in compliance with this Privacy Policy. We do not share your personal information with third parties without your consent except as follows:

Related and Affiliated Organizations. We may share your personal information with our affiliates and related organizations for use consistent with this Privacy Policy.

As Required by Blockchain Protocol. Transactions involving our NFTs will be conducted on the relevant blockchain protocol. This means information about your transfers will be provided to the blockchain and may be accessible to third parties due to the public nature of the blockchain. Please be advised that because entries to the blockchain are public, and because it may be possible for someone to identify you using external sources of information, any transaction you enter onto the blockchain could possibly be used to identify you or information about you.

Service Providers and Business Partners. We may share your personal information with third party companies and individuals as needed for them to provide us with services that help us with our business

activities and to promote our services to you. We may also share your personal information with our business partners who offer a service to you jointly with us.

Compliance, Fraud Prevention and Safety. We may disclose your personal information as we believe appropriate to government or law enforcement officials or private parties for the purposes described above under the section “For Compliance, Fraud Prevention and Safety.”

Business Transfers. We may sell, transfer or otherwise share some or all of our business or assets, including your personal information, in connection with a business deal (or potential business deal) such as a merger, consolidation, acquisition, reorganization or sale of assets, or in the event of bankruptcy.

Your Choices

You are not required to provide all personal information identified in this Privacy Policy to use our Site or to interact with us offline, but certain functionality will not be available if you do not provide personal information. For example, if you do not provide personal information, we may not be able to respond to your request, perform a transaction with you, or provide you with marketing that we believe you would find valuable.

Cookie Policy

What are Cookies? Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. Cookies set by the website are called “first party cookies”. Cookies set by parties other than the website are called “third party cookies”. Third party cookies enable third party features or functionality, such as advertising or website analytics, to be provided on or through the website. The parties that set these third party cookies can recognize your computer or device both when it visits the website in question and also when it visits certain other websites and/or mobile apps.

What Cookies and Other Tracking Technologies do We Use? On our Site we use strictly necessary cookies, which are cookies that are necessary for the Site to function and cannot be switched off in our systems; performance cookies, which allow us to count visits and traffic sources so we can measure and improve the performance of our Site; and functional cookies, which enable the Site to provide enhanced functionality and personalization.

Cookies are not the only way to track visitors to a website. We may use similar technologies from time to time, like web beacons (sometimes called “tracking pixels” or “clear gifs”). These are tiny graphics files that contain a unique identifier that enable us to recognize when someone has visited our Sites. These technologies often depend on cookies to function properly, and so disabling cookies may impair their functioning.

Third-Party Cookies. In addition to our own cookies, we use [Google Analytics](#) to provide us with demographic information about our visitors and to help us analyze how people use our website. International Data Use and Cross-Border Transfers. We are located in London and have affiliates and service providers in other countries, and your personal information may be collected, used and stored in the United Kingdom or other locations outside of your home country. Privacy laws in the locations where we handle your personal information may not be as protective as the privacy laws in your home country. However, we will handle your personal information in accordance with this Privacy Policy regardless of where your personal information is kept. We rely on adequacy decisions or the derogations for transfers which are necessary to perform the transaction with you. Children.

Changes to this Privacy Policy

Notice to European Users

The following applies to individuals in the European Economic Area, Switzerland and United Kingdom.

Controller. Sutter Systems LLP is the controller of your personal information covered by this Privacy Policy for purposes of European data protection legislation.

Legal bases for processing. We are required to inform you of the legal bases of our processing of your personal information, which are described in the table below. If you have questions about the legal basis

Processing Purpose	Legal Basis
To provide the Site, communicate with you, create and maintain your account, run our contests.	You are subject to a contract with us and we need to use your personal information to provide services you have requested or take steps that you request prior to providing services.
To establish and administer accounts, and process payments.	You are subject to a contract with us and we need to use your personal information to provide services you have requested or take steps that you request prior to providing services.
For compliance, fraud prevention, and safety.	These processing activities constitute our legitimate interests. We consider and balance the potential impact on your rights before we process your personal information for our legitimate interests. We do not use your personal information for activities where our interests are overridden by the impact on you (unless we have your consent or are otherwise required or permitted to by law).
For compliance with law.	Processing is necessary to comply with our legal obligations.
With your consent.	Where we specifically ask for your consent to process your personal information, such processing is based on your consent. Where we rely on your consent, you have the right to withdraw it anytime in the manner indicated on the Site.
To share your personal information as described in this Privacy Policy.	This sharing constitutes our legitimate interests, and in some cases may be necessary to comply with our legal obligations.

Retention. We will only retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements. To determine the appropriate retention period for personal information, we consider the amount, nature, and sensitivity of the personal information, the potential risk of harm from unauthorized use or disclosure of your personal information, the purposes for which we process your personal information and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal requirements.

Your Rights. European data protection laws give you certain rights regarding your personal information. You may ask us to take the following actions in relation to your personal information that we hold:

- *Access.* Provide you with information about our processing of your personal information and give you access to your personal information.
- *Correct.* Update or correct inaccuracies in your personal information.
- *Delete.* Delete your personal information.
- *Transfer.* Transfer a machine-readable copy of your personal information to you or a third party of your choice
- *Restrict.* Restrict the processing of your personal information.
- *Object.* Object to our reliance on our legitimate interests as the basis of our processing of your personal information that impacts your rights.

You may exercise your rights above by contacting us as detailed at the end of this Privacy Policy and specifying your request. We may request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and process your request. Applicable law may require or permit us to decline your request. If we decline your request, we will tell you why, subject to legal restrictions.
